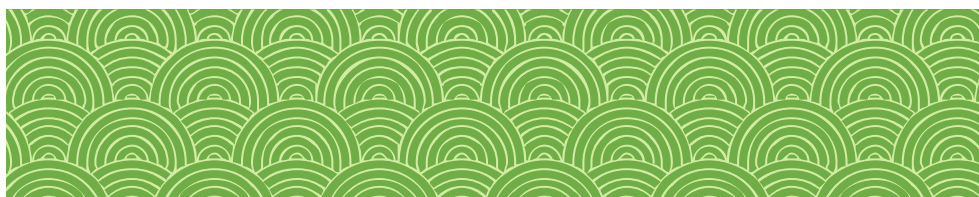
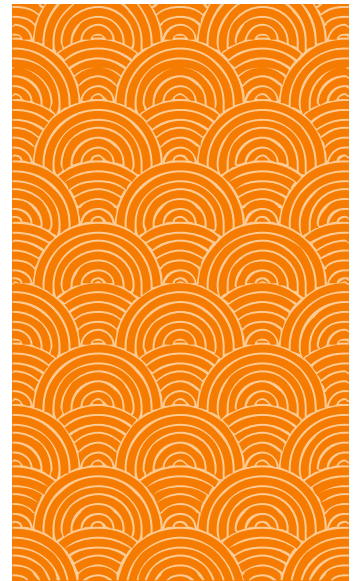
Keynote Speaker: Dr. George Halasz

Dr George Halasz is a Consultant in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry in private practice and Adjunct Senior Lecturer at Monash University. He has lectured in Australia and overseas at conferences, conducted workshops and participated on a range of panels. From 1992-2005 he was a member of the Editorial Board of the Australian and New Zealand Journal of Psychiatry, and since 2005, the Editorial Board of Australasian Psychiatry. He has written/co-edited three books, many chapters and journal articles that deal with ADHD, trauma transmission, child psychotherapy and ethics, spirituality and religion.

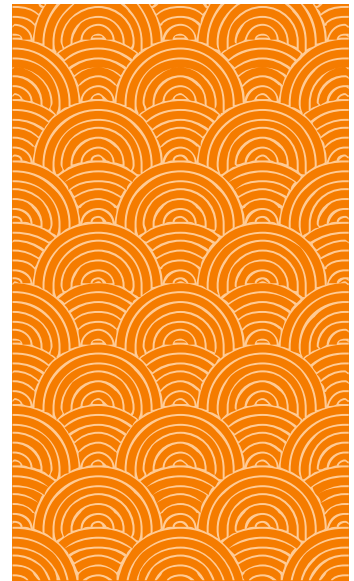
Dr. Kenneth Shut-wah CHAN

Dr. CHAN graduated from the Faculty of Medicine, The Chinese University of Hong Kong, in 2000 and had obtained his first fellowship in public health medicine in 2011. He embarked on psychiatry fellowship training since 2013, when he had served as a junior psychiatry trainee in general adult psychiatry, rehabilitation psychiatry in Castle Peak Hospital, then child & adolescence psychiatry and general adult psychiatry in Kwai Chung Hospital. Since 2016, he has been serving as a senior psychiatry trainee in substance abuse psychiatry, forensic psychiatry and general adult psychiatric at Castle Peak Hospital. Dr. CHAN has developed his interest in psychotherapy during his training years in the psychiatric unit of the New Territories West Cluster (NTWC), where he started to conduct his first psychodynamic psychotherapy for a patient since December 2016, under the supervision of Dr. Joyce SY CHOW, appointed psychotherapy supervisor by the Hong Kong College of Psychiatrists.



Dr. Dickson Lai-yin CHOW

Dr. Dickson Lai-yin CHOW is a specialist psychiatrist. He has a keen interest in psychotherapy and was trained in a variety of psychotherapeutic models including psychodynamic psychotherapy and family therapy. He holds a Graduate Diploma in Child Psychotherapy Studies from the Monash University and a Master of Health Sciences in Sexual Health from the University of Sydney. He is currently working in an out-patient clinic in the field of General Adult Psychiatry, Perinatal Psychiatry and in Transgender Mental Health. In his presentation, Dr. CHOW will share with you the treatment journey with a boy who was unwanted by his family of origin and how a therapist came around from the traumatization caused by the tragic ending of a therapy.



Dr. Marcella Lei-yee FOK

Dr. Marcella Fok, MRCPsych MD(Res) is a Consultant Psychiatrist and Psychotherapist currently working in South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trust and in private practice. Whilst training in psychiatry and psychotherapy (in South London and Maudsley, the Halliwick Personality Disorder Service, and the Fitzjohns Unit at the Tavistock), she developed an interest in working with people with personality disorder. This interest led her to complete her MD(Res) at the King's College London Institute of Psychiatry, Psychology and Neuroscience, researching the health, mortality and service use of this patient group. She is a training candidate in psychoanalysis with the British Psychoanalytical Association, and an elected member of the Medical Psychotherapy Faculty executive of the Royal College of Psychiatrists.



Dr. Ian Ming-yeung PAN

Dr. Pan was a UK medical graduate (MBChB, University of Manchester). He has become a member of the Royal College of Psychiatrist after obtaining MRCPsych in 2011. During his psychiatry training in the UK, he had experience in Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) and in psychodynamic psychotherapy, under the supervision of Dr. Bahia Sukhdip in 2011. After completing the Medical Council Medical Licensing



examination and gaining full registration in Hong Kong, Dr. Pan has been a Psychiatry Residential Trainee at the Castle Peak Hospital since 2015. At Castle Peak Hospital, Dr. Pan has conducted CBT under the supervision of Dr. Cola Lo (clinical psychologist) in 2016. From December 2016, Dr. Pan has started to conduct psychodynamic psychotherapy under the supervision of Dr. Jessica Wong.

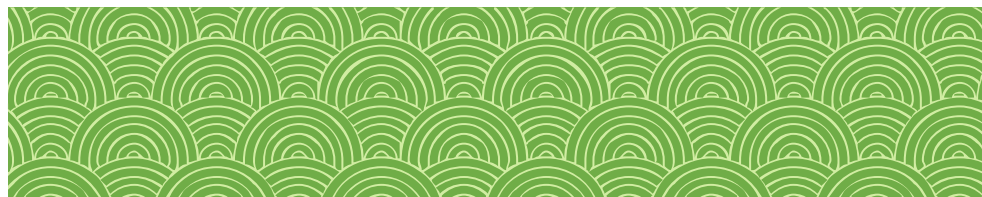
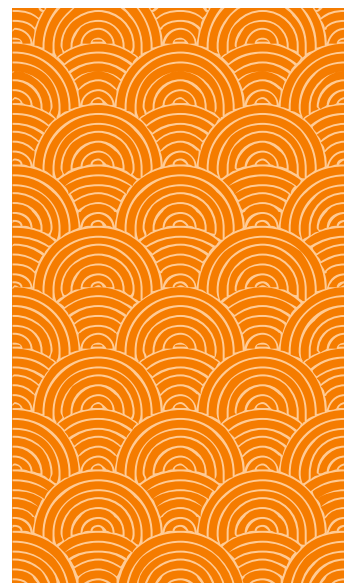
Dr. Candy Ching-Yi WONG
